## **Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2013/2014**

### ***Southwold***

- Small group teaching for Year 4, 5 & 6 to improve maths skills;
- Small groups of talking maths in year 3 & 4;
- Maths support teaching, one afternoon per week, for Year 4, 5 and Year 6;
- 1 to 1 reading for Year 1;
- Procurement of additional ICT learning resources;
- Drumming lessons for improvement of confident, concentration, focus and hand eye co-ordination;

### ***Barnby***

- Small group teaching for Year 6 pupils in maths and english;
- Support Teacher for teaching of comprehension skills, Years 6, 5, 3 & 2;
- Response to Ongoing Assessment;
- Small groups of phonics and spelling maths in years 2, 3 & 4;
- Continuing interventions with talking partners, phonics and reading support;
- One-to-one support for maths in Year 6;

## **Measuring the impact of PPG Spending 2013/2014**

The school will evaluate the impact on each pupil at the end of the autumn term. Evaluation will focus on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the intervention.
