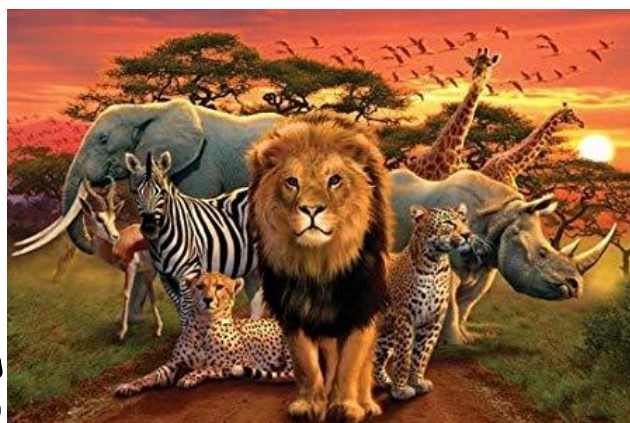


# Patterns



Reception	Nursery
<b>Communication and Language</b> Introduces a story or narrative into their play.	<b>Communication and Language</b> Listening to stories with increasing attention and recall.
<b>Reading</b> Hears and says the initial sounds on words.	<b>Reading</b> Shows an awareness of rhyme and alliteration.
<b>Writing</b> Gives meanings to marks they make as they draw, write and paint. Writes own name.	<b>Writing</b> Sometimes gives meaning to the marks they draw and paint.
<b>Physical Development</b> Experiments with different ways of moving. Uses tools to effect change to materials.	<b>Physical Development</b> Moves freely and with pleasure in a range of ways.
<b>Mathematics</b> Uses familiar objects and common shapes to create and recreate patterns and build models. Counts objects to 0 and beginning to count beyond 10.	<b>Mathematics</b> Uses number names spontaneously in play. Shows an awareness of shapes in the environment.
<b>Personal, social and emotional Development</b> Confident to speak to others about own needs, wants, interests and opinions.	<b>Personal, social and emotional Development</b> Can play in a group, extending and elaborating play ideas.
<b>Understanding the World</b> Learning about Africa and different African Animals. Looks closely at similarities, patterns and change.	<b>Understanding the World</b> Learning about Africa and different African Animals.
<b>Expressive Arts and Design</b> Explore what happens when they mix colours.	<b>Expressive Arts and Design</b> Sings a few familiar songs,
<b>Being Imaginative</b> Chooses a particular colour for purpose.	<b>Being Imaginative</b> Engages in imaginative role-play based on first hand experiences.
